

Are the Ten Commandments Relevant for TODAY?



"The commandments of the Lord are right, bringing joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are clear, giving insight for living." Psalm 19:8 NLT

Until modern times, the Ten Commandments, Bible reading, prayer, and the pledge of Allegiance to the American flag were the start of every school day across America. However, in recent times, prayer, Bible reading, and the Ten Commandments have all been removed from public property. Surprisingly, some have even suggested removing the pledge of Allegiance and the American flag.

On October 30, 2001, the ACLU filed a lawsuit against Judge Roy Moore for placing a Ten Commandments monument in the rotunda of the State Court House. The U.S. Federal Court ruled against Moore and for removing the monument. Eventually, Roy Moore was removed as a judge.

Today's world seems hostile toward the Ten Commandments and Christianity. Are the Ten Commandments relevant for today? Do we still need them in modern society?

Central Lesson

The Commandments are not a *checklist* for earning salvation but a *mirror* to show us our sinfulness and need for a Savior.

WHY We Need the Ten Commandments TODAY!

1. Reveal **GOD** and His **NATURE** to Us.

"Then God gave the people all these instructions...." (20:1).

God usually spoke through Moses or His Prophets (or in the N.T., the Apostles). However, He communicated the Commandments personally and directly to Israel. They heard the voice of God, just like Adam & Eve, Noah, Abraham, the patriarchs, and Moses. The experience caused them deep fear, so they asked Moses to speak for God rather than for God to speak to them (20:19).

The Ten Commandments revealed several things about God to Israel:

- He **existed** - they heard His voice, and *"...they saw the flashes of lightning and the smoke billowing from the mountain, they stood at a distance, trembling with fear."* (20:18).
- He **cared** about them - He approached them & spoke to them.
- He is **righteous** and **holy** - He gave them moral, righteous laws.
- He is **relational** - the Commandments were necessary for the covenant relationship with God.
- He was **all-powerful** and **miraculous** - they witnessed the ten plagues in Egypt, the parting of the Red Sea, the drowning of Egypt's army, etc., along with the majestic way He communicated the Ten Commandments (20:18).

The NLT Illustrated Study Bible explains: "The first four commandments relate to one's relationship with God. Observing them would foster a correct understanding of God in contrast to the idolatrous notions of deity that the Israelites had encountered in Egypt and would yet encounter in Canaan."

2. The Bases of **MORALITY**.

"¹² Honor your father and mother... ¹³ You must not murder. ¹⁴ You must not commit adultery. ¹⁵ You must not steal. ¹⁶ You must not testify falsely against your neighbor. ¹⁷ You must not covet your neighbor's house." (20:12-17).

3. **PROTECT** and **PROVIDE** Life's Best for Us.

Someone has explained that every negative "do not" statement of God is a "positive" statement. God is trying to **protect** us from improper behavior's harmful consequences and **provide** us with His best life.

4. A Spiritual **MIRROR** to Reveal Our Lostness & Need of a Savior.

*"For no one can ever be made right with God by doing what the law commands. The law simply **shows us how sinful we are.**"* Romans 3:20 NLT

Bible teacher, Warren Wiersbe, explains: "The law was never given as a way of salvation for either Jews or Gentiles, because '*by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified*' (Gal. 2:16)... The law reveals God's righteousness and demands righteousness, but it can't give righteousness (Gal. 2:21); only Jesus Christ can do that (2 Cor. 5:21). The law is a mirror that reveals where you're dirty, but you don't wash your face in the mirror (James 1:22-25). Only the blood of Jesus Christ can cleanse us from sin (1 John 1:7, 9; Heb. 10:22)... Then what's the purpose of the law? **It's God's way of showing us our sins and stripping us of our self-righteousness so that we cry out for the mercy and grace of God.**"

5. **DRIVES** Us to Christ, the Only Solution to Our Sinfulness.

*"Therefore the Law has become our [guardian] **tutor to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith.**"* Galatians 3:24 NASV

Summary of the Ten Commandments

1. You must not have any other god but me (20:3).
2. You must not make for yourself an idol of any kind (20:4).
3. You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God (20:7).
4. Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy (20:8).
5. Honor your father and mother (20:12).
6. You must not murder (20:13).
7. You must not commit adultery (20:14).
8. You must not steal (20:15).
9. You must not testify falsely against your neighbor (20:16).
10. You must not covet (20:17).

Central Lesson:
